## David's Collection...my special summary

It is very obvious David (not his real name) got a lot more out of stamp collecting than many others. There were never enough stamps for David.

Not only did he enjoy his personal collecting – but enjoyed helping others further their collecting interest. He enjoyed making custom pages for his own albums and for others – he enjoyed trading and selling his stamps.

David's collecting interests were wide and varied with many interesting country choices. He had a desire to fill every spot in his many albums – even if the stamp was not up-to his personal standards – his intention – to replace a poorer stamp with a better one when one came along.

I first met David at least 45 years ago when I sold him a stamp at one of the clubs' – a lifelong friendship started from that stamp. I'm sure he never said "no" when a collection was offered to him.

While reviewing the values of David's collections – much time was spent properly evaluating the stamps by condition, centering, hinged & never hinged values, copies and cancels – all of which have to be taken into consideration when properly valuing a stamp or a collection.

With catalogue values placed on the individual collections (with Jim's help on Germany) – total sales to-date are approx. \$30,000 with more to come... and the proceeds from sales going to David's family (thanks for allowing me to donate material and loose stamps to our youth groups – David would have liked that). Thanks again Mary - for the trust you placed in me to achieve the best results and joy working with David's collection. Many collectors are happy to have some of David's stamps as their own – particularly those who knew and associated with David.

## It's worth repeating...Story of two collections.

In both cases, these two collections had belonged to active stamp club members before their deaths. One here in Toronto area, the other person belonged to a club in Edmonton. Both large cities with very active stamp clubs.

In the Edmonton, both husband and wife were collectors and club members. Upon their passing (4 years ago) the collection went from one sibling to another sibling until it was determined no one wanted the collection, several binders, Canadian mint, FDC and shoe boxes). The current custodian of the collection, living in Oshawa, asked a neighbor, who owned a pick-up truck if he would take the collection to the recycling centre.

## Victory at Monte Cassino

In the Fall 2019 issue of PhilaJournal Ron Dell'Agnese wrote about the Monte Cassino in "Stamps of Italy". And in the Spring 2015 issue Mattia Guida wrote about the involvement of the Polish army in the allied campaign in Italy including the 4 battles of Monte Cassino.

At an elevation of 1700 feet, the Abbey of Monte Cassino overlooks the town of Cassino and the surrounding countryside. It was a major position of German defence line that stood in the way of the Allied forces to liberate Rome. From the vantage point of the Abbey, the German forces controlled air and ground fire against the Allies. It is estimated that during the fierce fighting of the four battles, the capture of Monte Cassino resulted in 55,000 Allied casualties including 281 officers and 3,503 other ranks of the Polish forces. German losses were about 20,000 killed and wounded. The fourth and final battle began on May 11th, 1944.



On May 17th, the Polish Second Corps under the leadership of General Władysław Anders launched what was to become the final attack on Monte Cassino. Under constant artillery and mortar fire from the strongly fortified German positions and with little natural cover for protection, the fighting was fierce and at times hand-to-hand. On the morning of May 18th Polish troops reached the ruins of the mountaintop monastery with no resistance to plant a Polish flag over the remains of the abbey. Overnight, the Germans had evacuated their positions, leaving behind thirty wounded men.









The Polish Government in Exile in the U.K. issued a set of overprinted stamps to mark the occasion.

While still in Italy, the Polish Second Corps issued a set of stamps including a souvenir sheet showing its involvement in the battles of Monte Cassino, Ancona and Bologna.

Following his death in London in 1970 General Anders was buried in accordance with his wishes, amongst his fallen soldiers at the Polish War Cemetery at Monte Cassino.

At the foot of the cemetery is an inscription in Polish which translates as:

Passerby, tell Poland that we fell faithfully in her service, for our freedom and yours, we Polish soldiers gave our souls to God, our bodies to the soil of Italy, and our hearts to Poland.



## Antonio Meucci

Alexander Graham Bell did not invent the telephone. No more than ten men were experimenting on trying to invent a "telephone", and one of them was Bell. An Italian, working in New York City was one of the ten.



The Italian was Antonio Meucci, who was born on April 13, 1808 in Florence, Italy. Meucci invented and patented many items, but spent much of his time experimenting on a product today known as the telephone. Meucci lived in Cuba for a few years, but then moved to New York City where he felt that opportunities were better. His latest invention was what he called the "telettrofono".

He demonstrated it in 1860 to the public, and had a description of it published in New York's Italian language newspaper (he was not fluent in English). Meucci filed a patent caveat for a telephone device in December 1871. Patent Caveats were valid for one year and did not permit anyone else to patent any similar invention during that year. Unfortunately, Meucci did not have \$10.00 that it cost to patent his telephone.

In March 1876, Bell, who conducted experiments in the same laboratory where Meucci worked, was granted a patent for a telephone and was thus credited with inventing the telephone. On Jan 13, 1887, the US government moved to annul the patent issued to Bell on the grounds of fraud and misrepresentation... Therefore, the inventor of the telephone, or telettrofono, was Antonio Meucci.

Italy has issued a number of stamps honouring Meucci. In 1965, a 70 lire stamp portraying Meucci and Marconi. In 1978, a 170 lire stamp (above)





portraying Meucci was issued as part of a 6 stamp set. In 2003, a 52 centesemi souvenir sheet with one stamp was issued.

## Mail in the time of Cholera

Full title: "Reggio Emilia (Italy) 1855: Disinfection labels during an epidemic of Asian Cholera"

I was inspired to write this article by a letter I acquired recently at an auction. The letter is dated August 3, 1855 and has been mailed by a local Reggio Emilia priest to the Health Superintendent in the same town.



Reggio Emilia is a town in Italy near Parma, Modena and Bologna.

This letter has been slit and fumigated as normally done during an epidemic, but also bears a special label to certify that the letter has been indeed disinfected and therefore it is authorized to be forwarded through the mail system and be delivered to the addressee.



In the year 1854 a large part of Italy started to be affected by a very nasty strain of cholera, named the Asian Cholera. The disease luckily would not transmit so easily but would be deadly in 100 per cent of the cases and the people infected would die within 24 hours from the time that the first symptoms started to appear.

The epidemic slowly moved through Italy from South to North and reached the Reggio Emilia area in mid-1854. The local authorities, when the disease

was approaching Reggio Emilia, decided to introduce a series of measures to contain the spread of the Asian Cholera. As at the time people believed that the disease could also spread through the mail, they introduced measures to disinfect all mail.

To make sure that all mail would be fumigated they introduced a special label which had to be affixed to the letter soon after fumigation. A letter without this special label could not be delivered.

The fumigation was made through chlorine fumes. The fumigation mix was obtained by mixing manganese peroxide with common salt, to which then was added sulphuric acid. The letters were first slit and then put in a special box where they were exposed to these disinfection fumes for a few minutes.






The labels were introduced on September 1854 and were used until October 1855, when finally the disease was contained and the fumigation was discontinued. In a period of 13 months the label design (always the words "Disinfection Office in Reggio" surrounded by an elaborate frame) was changed 3 times. So 4 different labels exist. I have 3 of the 4 type shown in the article.

The label is known always un-cancelled and on letters without stamps. The total number of labels printed in unknown but in any case most letters used during the cholera time were destroyed so a very limited number of letters with this label are known to exist. These labels can also be found loose in a mint condition but also in this

case only a limited number have survived those challenging times.

The fumigation was always performed by monks and members of the clergy. This because the local authorities were concerned about protecting the privacy of the messages contained in the letters.

By the way the message contained in this letter is short but very interesting. The priest is writing to his Superintendent to inform him that an individual mentioned in a previous letter of the same day has already died. So the priest requests instructions on where and how this person could be safely buried.

## The Siam 1920 Scouts Fund Overprints

The Siam 1920 Scouts Fund Overprints became one of the earliest issues of scout stamps.

King Rama VI was an early advocate of scouting. In 1920 three sets of stamps, totaling 19 stamps honoring their kings, were overprinted as a means of receiving a tax to support the "Scouts Fund". The scouts in Siam were known as the "Wild Tiger Corps" and as a result the head of a tiger was included in each of the three types of overprints.



The resultant three sets of overprinted Semi-Postal stamps were Scott numbers B12 to B17 (Type 1), B18 to B23 (Type 2) and B24-B30 (Type 3).

These overprints are easier to duplicate than the stamps themselves and this has led to some counterfeit overprints.

In addition, nine government postal cards were also over-printed, three of each type. These are very scarce and thus very expensive.



## York Region responsible for Canada?

Who remembers that the Northern part of the York region played a pivotal role in the history of Canada, anticipating the creation of Canada as we know it today? Astounding events took place centred on the towns of Sharon (formerly Hope) and Holland Landing (all in East Gwillimbury, North of Newmarket).

During the first half of the 19th century the lands north of the Oak Ridges Moraine were the frontier. Roads were hacked through the woods and some pioneers established themselves with their families in clearings along newly drawn concession lines.

The "Children of Peace", a group that split from the Quakers in Newmarket, established Hope. Their philosophy of justice and equality, drawn from the Bible, lead some of their members to participate in the 1837 rebellion. One of them, from Holland Landing, Samuel Lount, was hung for his participation in the march down Yonge Street and the ensuing skirmish at Montgomery's Inn. The underlying reason for the rebellion was the demand for responsible government, i.e. "A government that has to justify to the electorate their policies and actions." The first election to the "House of Assembly" for the newly united Canadas ("Province of Canada", formerly Lower and Upper Canada) was held in 1841. Among the candidates were two lawyers who argued for responsible government: Robert Baldwin and

Louis-Hippolyte LaFontaine. Baldwin was from York, now Toronto, Anglophone and most likely Protestant. a LaFontaine was from Boucherville, Lower Canada, Francophone and Catholic. The government of the day tried to influence the outcomes elections through



intimidation and locating polling stations in places favouring the government's party.

In 1841, the Children of Peace held a campaign rally for Baldwin and LaFontaine in their Temple, where they rejoiced to say that "we have it in our power to show our impartial respect to the Canadian people of the Lower Province." Despite threats of Orange Order violence, LaFontaine was elected as representative of 4th York." (Wikipedia, July 27, 2019). Fourth York, the Northern part of today's York Region was overwhelmingly Anglophone and Protestant.

Later, in 1843, Baldwin was elected to represent an overwhelming Francophone and Catholic riding of Rimouski, East of Quebec City. It is worth noting that the electorates overcame prejudices towards other languages or religious groups which were prevalent in those days.

It was not until 1848 that the first freely elected government in the British colonies took power in Nova Scotia and the Baldwin - LaFontaine government shortly thereafter.

In 1927, to celebrate Canada's 60th birthday, Canada Post issued a commemorative stamp (Scott # 148) depicting both politicians. Two other stamps were issued at the same time for three other fathers of confederation: Thomas D'Arcy McGee, John A. MacDonald, and Wilfred Laurier.

One could argue that the above-mentioned stamp also honours the electorates of Rimouski and the North York area and their push for democracy. On another level, it is a reminder, that VOTING MATTERS.

Fortunately, an Oshawa Senior Member suggested they call me before dumping all and the collection was saved...donating some to youth and selling the rest to other collectors.

In the Toronto case, even more bizarre; this man passed away a few years ago. His collection, over 100 binders and several shoe boxes, had 3 different "stamp people" involved. One bought the mint Canada at an extremely low price, the last 20 years of post office purchases, for \$300. Two others collectors actually took the balance of the collection away, untimely returning it back to the owner as they felt there was not sufficient value or time to do the work to sell the collection. Exasperated, the owner who did not drive, asked a neighbour to take the balance to the dump. Fortunately, I was contacted through that neighbour and the collection was untimely sold to other collectors, with the youth benefiting as well. Please put directions with your collections.


