My contribution on this page will be a repeat of few items from the fall issue, as well as, some new observations and pleas. This is another digital only edition of the PhilaJournal. Hope you enjoy it. Please let me know if you are having issues or challenges with downloading or reading it on-line.

YES, we are staying with this format. The printer bleed allowance has been removed to accommodate printing 2 pages landscape on a regular letter size page; if printing is required. Distribution is done via link to a Google drive or issues can be emailed to Club members by their GTAPA Directors.

Not being bound by the multiples of four pages for the printer and the weight of each issue for the postage we can start experimenting. Ideas?

It is noticeable that you can now click on any link and be taken to that web site. You can enlarge the pictures on each page to see more details.

The addition of **FREE Classified ads** after page 32 was welcomed with several submissions, but unfortunately I only had one new one for this issue, pity. All previous ads (marked (2)) will expire and be removed unless the <u>advertiser sends me a request to renew</u> for the next 2 issues. I would also appreciate feedback if you had success with these ads. These are for members only so please identify which Club you are member of.

Oh, and remember to send your ads to the Editor only.

Important changes to the PhilaJournal numbering system. Until now we started a new volume in Aug. (Fall, issue #1) and then Nov. (Winter, #2), 2 issues in one year and continued with Feb. (Spring #3) and May (Summer #4) of the next year. It was confusing...Therefore the current Vol. XVIII that started in 2019 will have 6 issues – this is the last one, #6 (WN 74). Year 2021 will start with Vol. XIX. The Feb. issue will be #1 (WN 75), May #2 (WN 76), Aug. #3 (WN 77) and Nov. #4 (WN 78). Year 2022 will be Volume XX (WOW!!!).

Important change to the Club dues schedule. We have not been able to meet since March. The GTAPA executives proposed that the annual Club Dues will not be collected starting August (as previously) and be free for the months of Sept. to Dec. of 2020. Starting in 2021 the Club Dues will become annual, based on a calendar year. The amount stays at \$2/member (clubs pay based on their club's PhilaJournal readership) and will be payable AT the first meeting in January. This will simplify payment and collecting of the dues. Each club will have time from Aug. to Dec. to deliver the next year's dues.



Eight World Jamboree Photo Postcard

The Eighth World Jamboree was held at Niagara-On-The-Lake on August 18-28, 1955. The official opening was August 20 when a stamp (Scott 356) was issued to welcome scouts from around the world. Many brought their own covers to mail from the Jamboree. In fact, over 175 different first day covers have been identified from this Jamboree.





John Barchino of Brantford, ON created his own photo postcard. It exists with the Jamboree stamp on the front or back and with either of the two special Jamboree slogan cancels or the Ottawa *Day of Issue* cancel.



Its design was based on the July 1935 Boys' Life magazine cover,

drawn by the famed illustrator, Norman Rockwell, to promote the 1935 USA National Jamboree. This magazine cover was reproduced on the above seal by BSA (Boy Scouts of America). That Jamboree was postponed to 1937 on short notice because of a Polio epidemic.

Two Events, One Stamp Set

There are times when a country will issue a stamp (or a set of stamps) to honour two events. In1934, Italy did just that. A set of six stamps were issued on November 5, 1934. The stamps were all alike except for the denominations and colours. The stamps portrayed King Victor Emanuel III, and were issued in honour of his 65th birthday, as well as for the inauguration of the non-stop flight from Rome to Mogadiscio, Somalia.

The face value of the stamps are 1, 2, 4, 5, 8, and 10 lire (Scott C73-78).



Victor Emmanuel III was a King of Italy from July 29, 1900 to May 9, 1946. He initially ruled as a constitutional monarch, but went against the government by bringing Italy into WWI on the side of the Allies. In 1922, he made Mussolini the premier. The fascist government then reduced him to a figurehead. Later he played an important role in Mussolini's fall, but was tarnished by his association with fascism. He abdicated in 1946 and passed his power to his son Umberto II. He died December 1947 in exile in Egypt. In 2017, his remains were brought back to Italy and buried near Turin.




Mogadiscio's population was approximately 100,000 in 1940, of which one third were Italians. Travelling from Italy to Mogadiscio was about 7hrs and 5,500km by air (with 3 stops and changes of planes), and about 11,500km by vehicles and or

boats. A trip down the Nile River would take about 1 week. These non-stop flights resulted in many Italians relocating to Mogadiscio. A set of these stamps mint hinged catalog about \$75USD, and about \$2,300USD used.

SLOGAN - T2E 0A0 / T2E 0A0



- On the PHSC website Coutts list as slogan T-0507 with only date being 5-Dec-00.
- Joel Weiner's listing as of 2008 list as **087-22a** early 1-Dec-00 and late 11-Dec-00.
- My collection has early 1-Dec-00 and late 12-Dec-00.

This cover is in between. Why is it special?

Well it is a greeting card size so the slogan is from a different printer.

- 1. T2E 0A0 is the Postal Code for the Calgary Mail Processing Plant
- 2. Before the T2E slogan have Calgary Grey Cup slogan dated 1-Dec-00
- 3. After the T2E slogan have Santa HOHOHO slogan dated 12-Dec-00
- 4. To confuse the annalysis, there is a human readable Visual Encoder System (VES) marking from Hamilton dated 10-Dec. VES readable markings are Month and date with a code for the Processing Plant (light violet vertical lines at the bottom of cover).



The cover has DE 6T from Calgary which confirms the date on the front and the DE10P which confirms being processed at Hamilton. This style Inkjet is from an Image printer. These had 2 printing heads with 4 lines each, so 8 lines can appear. The location of the lines can be measured from the bottom of covers.

The lower printer produced lines 1,2,3 and 4, whereas the upper printer produced lines 5,6,7 and 8. Measuring from the bottom of the cover the inkjet is lines 5 and 6. My other two covers were printed by lines 1 & 2 and lines 2 & 3. This makes the cover a variety that I had never seen before. Thus it goes into my collection.

Well having three different varieties means there are another 5 possible. Doubt all exist but maybe. Also the cover has bar codes on. First few bars identify the Optical Character Reader (OCR) which confirms machie 87. On the back are more bars and these are the VES number. The machine numer is 3687 which confirms machine 87, again.

In this Pandemic times I am at home and can take the time to play with a single cover. Maybe you can look at an old cover and create a new reason to collect Postal History. Amazing what you can find if you continue to look at a cover.



Pashtunistan - Promoting a Lost Cause on Stamps

Pashtuns, also known as Pukhtuns or Pathans, are an ethnolinguistic group, native to South and Central Asia. The native language of the Pashtuns is Pashto, an Iranian language on the Indo-Iranic branch of the Indo-European language family. The total number of Pashtuns is estimated to be around 63 million, divided mainly between present-day Afghanistan and Pakistan.

In 1893, Mortimer Durand drew the 'Durand Line' through Pashto-speaking areas, fixing the limits of the spheres of influence between Afghanistan and British India and leaving about half of the Pashtun territory under British rule. The Durand Line now forms the internationally-recognized border between Afghanistan and Pakistan.



Prominent 20th century proponents of a Pashto-speaking homeland simply wanted a province called Pashtunistan. There was support, however, to rename North-West Frontier Province of British India as Pakhtunkhwa ("Area of Pashtuns"). This area joined the Dominion of Pakistan in 1947.



In the 1960s, General Daoud Khan, then Afghanistan's Prime Minister, supported a nationalistic reunification of the Pashtuns in Pakistan with those in Afghanistan. However, he failed to gain any support from Pakistani Pashtuns. Pakistan then closed its border with Afghanistan. This caused an economic crisis in Afghanistan.

By the end of the 1960s, growing Pashtun participation in the Pakistani government resulted in the erosion of the secessionist Pashtunistan movement's support. Additionally, continued resentment against Daoud's autocratic rule, close ties with the Soviet

Union, and an economic downturn, resulted in a Pakistani blockade.

King Zahir Shah forced Daoud to resign and, under the King, relations between Pakistan and Afghanistan improved. This resulted in Pakistan re-opening its border with Afghanistan. In 1973, Daoud seized power from the King, in a military coup d'état, and declared himself to be the first President of Afghanistan.

Daoud again attempted to renew the concept of a 'Pashtunistan.' He established several training camps in Kabul and Kandahar, with the aim of training and arming militants to carry out activities against Pakistan. However, interest in a 'Pashtunistan' waned, due



mainly to improved relations between the two countries.

In 1976, Daoud Khan finally recognized the Durand Line as the international border between Pakistan and Afghanistan. This declaration essentially ended the Pashtunistan issue. Afghanistan continued to issue stamps promoting Pashtunistan for seven more years.

This included regular, semi-postal and souvenir sheet stamps, between 1951 and 1983. Issues decreased in frequency from the 1960s to the 1980's.





Unusual Postage Stamps

In the present Covid-19 pandemic stamp clubs and societies have been unable to meet in person. This has led to various groups offering online presentations using platforms such as Zoom. It was at a presentation that I found information for this issue of the Unusual Postage Stamps.

Dr. Jean Wang of the North Toronto Stamp Club recently gave two presentations titled "Covid-19 Related Philately". The first was in June as part of her club's on-line program and then an updated version in September for SEAPEX 2020 (Seattle Philatelic Exhibition–Virtual Stamp Show).

Jean showed a pane of 15 stamps issued by Indonesia as both perforated and imperforate. What makes this unusual is the tagging shows simulated Covid-19 virus when viewed under an UV light.



Derwin Mak, also of the North Toronto Stamp Club, gave a Zoom presentation to the Philatelic Specialists Society of Canada titled "Superman, Stamps, Covers and Postmarks of the Man of Steel!" In that presentation Derwin included 6 stamps issued by Jersey showing various powers attributed to Superman. See pg.24

45p – Can be scanned with smartphone Smartsy App to watch interview with Henry Cavill.

55p – Transparent, self-adhesive stamp represents Superman's X-ray vision.

60p – Printed on silver foil to represent Superman's strength.

68p – Printed in thermochromic ink. When heat is applied to this stamp, the Earth appears below Superman.


80p – Contains a particle of crushed granite from a pebble from Beauport Bay. Represents Superman's strength.

88p – Has message from Superman's father Jor-El in glow-in-the-dark green ink (visible only in darkness).

North Toronto Stamp Club: our Facebook page



Our Club has had a Facebook page for quite a while but the number of people (basically only Club members) participating to the page was quite low and it was basically used as a tool to remind our members of some activities & events that we were planning to have at the Club.

What is the benefit of joining the NTSC group? Well, of course an important factor is the opportunity of getting information, not only on the Club programs, but in general on everything relating to philately. Whatever the questions they submit, Members now know that somebody sooner or later will have a satisfactory answer for them. With an expansion of viewers who...

...live also outside Ontario and Canada, the chance of finding an "expert" in a specific issue has increased considerably. Some members are simply trying to identify a particular stamp or a specific cancel, others are interested in finding out about the value of a certain stamp, many want to learn about exhibiting, while others are interested in what type of hinges or stock books they should use etc., and it is really exciting to see that; no matter how difficult the question is, after a few hours they will get one or more answers. Of their own initiative, some members have taken the charge of checking the Facebook page regularly, trying to find an answer for the members' in-need. It is a very pleasant confirmation of the spirit of solidarity and the altruistic attitude that many stamp collectors have when they communicate with their fellow stamp collectors.

The group has not been created with the objective of selling stamps but we have received requests from members that wanted to be allowed to sell some stamps and we have agreed to start it in a moderate way and as an experiment. We will follow the developments of this activity for the next couple of months (until year end) and then we will decide how to regulate it and expand it, if this is what our members are interested in.

Unfortunately not all our members own a computer or are computer savvy so some still continue to be left out and need to be contacted and involved in the Club in other ways. However it is also true that the new pressures of this pandemic and the need to adjust to the new circumstances has brought many members to become more familiar with the computers and internet. When we started our first virtual meeting we were concerned that we would not have too many participants and yet... we had more participants than in a normal in person meeting at the Club. We discovered that many kids or grandkids had done an excellent job in introducing their parents or grandparents to "Zoom" and to the beauties of internet


