Garfield Portch, GTAPA rep from West Toronto Stamp Club, is to be congratulated on receiving a Large Gold for his Postal History exhibit title "The Half-Cent Small Queen of Canada and Its Usage". Congratulations also to the many other members of GTAPA clubs who received awards for their exhibits.

CAPEX 22 - In Retrospect

Canada's first international stamp exhibition since CAPEX 96 was as successful an exhibition as we all had hoped for. After over two years of planning by a dedicated committee, and all the hesitancy over whether COVID-19 would force a cancellation if the Metro Toronto Convention Centre would have had to remain closed due to provincial public health restrictions, it all



came together for those four glorious days of philatelic festivities in early June.

A stamp exhibition of the magnitude of CAPEX 22 doesn't just happen. Planning and coordination take many, many hours. The committee had many hurdles to consider and overcome – whether enough dealers would register, whether our seamless customs broker procedure would satisfy our foreign dealers; would we be able to fill 400 exhibit frames; could we borrow and transport these 400 exhibit frames; would enough counties decide to send commissioners to bring such exhibits from their home countries; would we fill enough hotel spaces, and at reasonable cost, as blocked out for attendees; would we attract a large enough number of show goers; could we develop a registration procedure that would work efficiently and effectively; and could we stay on top of a myriad of little glitches that would quite naturally arise as we moved closer to and through the four days of the exhibition?

Providing well-coordinated information and advance publicity about the exhibition was just one of the activities that had to be coordinated and performed. A dedicated website, capex22.org, had to be written, launched, and kept continuously updated. Dealers and auction houses had to be approached and invited to attend. Articles and advertisements needed to be placed in the philatelic press and in society journals. Potential registrants had to be kept informed with a weekly digital newsletter, CAPEX News, for the latest news and information. That newsletter had to go out to as many stamp collectors and philatelic organizations as could be envisioned by all the members of the committee. Philatelic organizations and societies needed to be invited to hold meetings or provide seminars, and a schedule of events then needed to be drawn up to accommodate everyone.

Large stamp shows in downtown Toronto are very, very expensive to support. Corporate doners in the trade had to be solicited for sponsorship, and guarantors also needed to be approached. Some major societies gave generously in support of CAPEX 22. A fair price admission had to be determined for show participants, and even the cost of banquet tickets needed to not be entirely out of reach for the interested attendee.

Thanks to our large contingent of floor volunteers during the show, many, if not most, from the GTAPA, daily operations at the show worked very smoothly. Appreciations are due all around here.

The exhibition was successful as stamp collectors, exhibitors, societies, dealers, judges, and commissioners all committed their time to attendance. Show registrants came from across Canada, with 25 coming from BC, and over 600 coming from the GTA area alone. 400 adult and 11 youth exhibit applications were accepted, with 388 being shown on the floor (some did not arrive due to COVID or travel visa concerns of foreign commissioners). 101 of these were from Canadian exhibitors from all corners of the country. 38 of the exhibits brought by Americans were former Champion of Champions (C of C) contenders, and four had been C of C winners. 58 of the exhibits from other countries received a Gold medal during the CAPEX competition.

Over 25 local, national and international societies participated at CAPEX 22, with society tables, presentations, meetings, and planned social events. International dealers and auction houses were well-represented in the bourse, despite there being other International exhibitions occurring just around CAPEX 22 too.

Commissioners came from about 20 different countries, each bringing their country's accepted exhibits. A jury of 28 judges, mostly for other countries but also including seven Canadian judges, evaluated the exhibits and the philatelic literature entries, and awarded a total of 87 Gold medals (90 points or higher), 24 of these being awarded to exhibits from Canada.

CAPEX 22 was the first, but not the last, one-frame international stamp championship exhibition. Already one is now being planned for San Diego CA in the next few years.

As David McLaughlin, the Exhibition's chairman concluded in July: "I want to thank our sponsors, guarantors, donors, societies, dealers, volunteers, and every person and organization who supported CAPEX 22 and participated in the exhibition. CAPEX 22 has been an endeavour of all Canada's Philatelic communities, successfully completed during a difficult time in our history. You share in the success."

A Brief History of the Greater Toronto Area Philatelic Alliance; GTAPA for short.

Late in 2001, an invitation was distributed to all active stamp clubs operating in the Greater Toronto area asking for delegates to meet at the Scarborough Stamp Club. The first meeting on January 23, 2002 was attended by:

North Toronto Stamp Club: Ernie Nyitrai, Herb Letsche, Dave Bowles, Doug Irwin, John Wilson, and John Laraway


North York Stamp Club: Joe Malboeuf, Lev Levner

Scarborough Stamp Club: Peter Butler (host), Doug Cockburn, Ron Dell'Agnese, Frank Locke, Dave Ashley, Jerry Merlaid, Rick Howard

West Toronto Stamp Club: Reay Cairns, Frank Alusio, and Garfield Portch

Opening remarks by Peter Butler earned him the unofficial title of "Father

of the GTAPA". Peter observed that many smaller stamp clubs were in danger of failing for a number of reasons. He went on to suggest that, while maintaining the individual identities of participating Clubs, a union of clubs could share resources and programs for the benefit of all. It was generally agreed that the idea was worthy of further meetings to plan action. Peter, in his memo to attendees on February 25, 2002, suggested that the fourth Wednesday of each month seemed to be a good meeting date and that Clubs could take turns hosting the meetings.

From those meetings, the GTAPA was born and the Constitution was published in May 2002 (check PhilaJournal #1). Each participating club contributed two representatives that elected GTAPA Executive Committee. The elected officers were Peter Butler (president), Dorothy Attwells (vice president), Frank Alusio (treasurer), Ernie Nyitrai (secretary), and Richard Weigand (editor). See Picture 1.

The initial projects for the GTAPA included the creation of *PhilaJournal* to replace a newsletter and the creation of a corporate identity. The first editor of *PhilaJournal* was Frank Alusio, followed by Garfield Portch, Susan Butler, and Tom Malicki. The logo was the subject of a contest that was won by Terri Tettmar of the West Toronto Stamp Club. *PhilaJournal* has been well recognized with high-level awards in literature competitions at the American Philatelic Society and recently at CAPEX22.

To recognize the 'spark plugs' in the GTAPA member Clubs, Peter also



recommended the creation of the *CERTIFICATE OF MERIT*. To date, more than fifty certificates have been issued for outstanding service to their Club and to philately in general.

The first major undertaking of GTAPA was to obtain the right to use the name STAMPEX (from the Canadian Association of Philatelic Exhibitors) and to combine with the Canadian Stamp Dealers Association to produce the exhibition side of the stamp show known as **STAMPEX 2003**. Again, Peter Butler was the main factor in creating this alliance and ensuring its success.

Following the success at STAMPEX, GTAPA was offered free use of the meeting room at the *Vincent Graves Greene Philatelic Research Foundation* for all meetings. The Foundation continues as the 'home' of GTAPA and also provides a permanent mailing address.

To encourage Club participation at the shows a special competitive event "The Club Challenge" was launched. Clubs were encouraged to enter a team of three single-frame exhibits whose combined score would determine the winner of a specially commissioned trophy. The winning Club was to be the recipient of the newly created *Challenge Award*. A medal was struck featuring the logo plus a lanyard indicating the award level (gold, silver, etc.). As GTAPA expanded to include several Clubs to the north and east of Toronto several Clubs hosted Club shows, picnics, auctions, Circuit Book evenings, and guest lectures. These remote meetings were not always well attended but were considered to be a huge success by attendees.

Success breeds success and the GTAPA went on to produce the exhibition side of **STAMPEX 2004**, **STAMPEX 2005**, **AMERISTAMPEXPO 2006**, and **ROYAL*2007*ROYALE**. Again, Peter Butler was a key player in each of these events. At each of these events, the GTAPA volunteers were blue vests (making us look like Walmart greeters) to create a visible awareness.


Among the great events were the three bus excursions, organized by Peter Butler, for weekends at the American Philatelic Society. About forty collectors from the GTAPA and GRVPA will have fond memories of the tours, lectures, and good food experienced in 72-hour philatelic events.

To reach beyond the circulation of *PhilaJournal*, a website was created (www.gtapa.org). Currently administered by Jerry Kalyn it features general information, recognized award winners, and contains a calendar of events. It also provides easy and free access for everyone to the issues of *PhilaJournal* starting with the first one. The website was recently recognized with an award of excellence at CAPEX22 in the class of digital literature.

This brief history may seem a bit superficial but it does show that Peter Butler's initial idea was a good and successful idea that continues to deserve the respect and support of the local philatelic community.

(Note: This history is written from memory and a few actual notes. Every effort has been made to include all the important players but apologies to anyone I missed. Garfield)




Picture 7 - 2003 Peter Butler receives first GTAPA medal from Garfield Portch

varieties or copies on cover.

With only one hundred covers printed,

our unique Canadian variety, will add fun and enjoyment to the search for that illusive, "thirteenth". Canada's very own, "Flag over Portch" issue, on a cachet with a pictorial cancel of the GTAPA logo and Stampex '03, was created as a fundraiser for the Greater Toronto Area Philatelic Alliance. A signed copy promises to be a much sought-after cover and a very fine addition to any collection of personalized stamps, philatelic show covers or tributes to great Canadians.

Garfield Portch is a valued member of the West Toronto Stamp Club and he represents the club on the Board of the Greater Toronto Area Philatelic Alliance. Garfield has

many philatelic interests including a fine collection of Canada's Small Queens. In his professional life he is a successful insurance broker. He often opens the daily mail and likes to frank all out-going letters because he loves to share his excitement and enthusiasm for Canadian stamps with his policyholders.


STAMPEX 2003 by Frank Alusio

On the weekend of 17-18 October 2003, the Stamp Show scene changed in Toronto. After years of hiatus, CSDA in partnership with GTAPA resurrected STAMPEX, a National Stamp Exhibition and Bourse.

Rick Day, then a President of CSDA, was quoted as saying "Our partnership has brought about the revival of the traditional stamp show of years past, where a marketplace was joined by a philatelic exhibition, seminars, and workshops for collectors. We know that this year's show incorporates the above, plus some innovations to make the experience both engaging and informative about the many aspects of the greatest hobby in the world, stamp collecting."

In the winter 2003 issue of PhilaJournal Frank Alusio wrote: "As Chair of the Exhibition component of STAMPEX 2003, I would like to convey my personal thanks to team leaders Peter Butler, Doug Irwin, Ernie Nyitrai, Garfield Portch, Bob Thorne, and many volunteers from Club Members affiliated with GTAPA without whom it would have not been the success it was."

Story of the GTAPA Logo by Frank Alusio FRPSC



The Board agreed that there was a need to develop a distinctive, unique, and service-oriented organization to design an instantly recognizable logo to promote GTAPA.

The contest was open to all GTAPA Club members with a deadline of February 01, 2003. The prize was: \$100.00. The Logo would be used for

PhilaJournal masthead, letterheads, flyers, medals, etc.

Seventeen designs from three Clubs were received and at March 2003 Board meeting the Directors selected a winner. It was the rendition of the late Mrs. Terri Tettmar-Alusio (daughter of Frank Alusio) then a member of the West Toronto Stamp Club. She graciously donated the \$100.00 prize to the Alliance to defray the cost of the printing and distribution of *PhilaJournal*.

An accolade to Peter Butler.

Larry Friend wrote: "...Peter gave everything to the hobby and GTAPA - also I would not have been President of GTAPA if it had not been for Peter..."

Tony Manson wrote: "...Peter was the one who contacted me, then met me for coffee and talked me (SOSSI) into joining GTAPA..."

Susan Butler wrote: "...Peter was a driving force. Believe me. I lived it... He and Garfield talked every night! They were so excited. It was amazing, to me, how Peter used his experience in rescuing "sick" schools to resuscitate the local [stamp] clubs... Some people don't realize how many hours Frank and Peter and Garfield (who was still working) spent discussing how to make it happen, developing guidelines, and the "saying" [See front cover] and membership criteria.

I also remember how passionate and inspirational Peter was when he visited clubs to get them "on board". He loved it.

Yes, he was the first GTAPA president from inception [2002] to 2009.

He lives in a different world now but at least I get to see him every day. He definitely lives in the moment. We've had a wonderful summer so far... Stratford, movies, family visits, Revera activities. We go out every day."

Several people have asked me how Peter is. He is physically well but, as some of you know, in November 2018, he was diagnosed with Vascular Dementia.







Wasaga Beach & the Nancy story.

Wasaga Beach for decades has been known as The Longest Freshwater Beach in the World, but it has very important ties to the formation of Canada, the country we now inhabit. In the early 1800s, Upper Canada, as it was known then, was drawn into the War between the United States & Great Britain, which was declared in 1812 and lasted until 1814.

During a naval battle in 1813, the American fleet defeated and captured the British fleet, thereby gaining control of the Upper Great Lakes (The upper Great Lakes are Lakes Superior, Michigan-Huron, and Erie, which are separated from Lake Ontario by the Niagara escarpment.)



The last surviving British ship, a Schooner named Nancy, was a fur trading vessel that had been pressed into service during the War. On August 13th, 1814, three American ships arrived at the mouth of the Nottawasaga River at Wasaga Beach and spotted the Nancy anchored up the river, where it was hiding from the enemy ships.

In the ensuing battle, the Americans, with a lucky direct hit, exploded the blockhouse that the captain of the Nancy, Lieutenant Miller Worsley had built

to store ammunition and supplies. As the blockhouse burned, so did the Nancy to its waterline, as it was moored alongside.

The remnants of the Nancy were discovered in 1911 and it was raised in 1928 to be located in a single building on what is known as Nancy Island. The present buildings are now known



as a National Museum called <u>Nancy Island Historic Site</u>, which is open for viewing from May to September.

However, the story does not end with the burning of Nancy. Lieutenant Worsley and his crew of 22 sailors, 23 Native warriors & 9 French-Canadian voyageurs pursued two of the American ships, paddling and rowing for 300 miles to Mackinac Island, where they surprised, overpowered, and captured both American ships, thereby ensuring the control of the Upper Great Lakes for Great Britain and ultimately Canada.


As the 200th anniversary of this conflict approached in 2012, our Georgian Bay Coin & Stamp Club decided to produce a cache and Canada Post Picture

Postage stamp honouring the Nancy, as the hull is located in Wasaga Beach, and one of our two chapters has its home here also. We asked a local artist,

Ron Watson, to design our stamp and the cachet. The initial order was successful, so we asked the same artist to sketch Lt. Worsley and we produced a second Picture Postage stamp, showing him in full uniform. To finish off our contribution to the festivities, we asked for and received permission to use the painting "The Last Stand of the Nancy" by famed Canadian artist, Peter Rindlisbacher, showing the blockhouse explosion that sank the Nancy for a third Picture Postage stamp.



As a side note, Ron Watson also designed the cancellation used by the Wasaga Beach Post Office on all mail, for 8 years. This also showed Nancy in full sail, until it was replaced recently by another cancellation that Ron designed. The Coin side of our club also produced two medals, one in copper, and one in silver for this occasion. If there is any interest in obtaining the cache, I do have some available, just email me.



The same envelope was used for all three stamps as they were issued.

The Nancy Island Historic Site holds an annual re-enactment of the battle, with volunteers dressing up as both American and British soldiers with muskets blazing and folks camping in tents, all dressed in period costumes of course. It's usually a weekend in August, check the website.



1931 Imperial Airways Mail: England ← Australia




England to Australia: the first of two experimental flights to Australia left Croydon on fourth of April, there already was a regular Imperial Airways service from London to Delhi, a Qantas service from Darwin

to Brisbane, and an Australian National Airways service from Brisbane to Melbourne. The plan was to connect these services with Imperial Airways

flying the missing leg from Delhi to Darwin. In 1937, with the introduction of Short Empire flying boats built at Short Brothers, Imperial Airways could offer a through-service from Southampton to the Empire. By mid-1937 Imperial had completed its thousandth



service to the Empire. Starting in 1938 Empire flying boats also flew between Britain and Australia via India and the Middle East.

Australia to England: In April 1931 an experimental London-Australia air mail flight took place. The mail was transferred at the Dutch East Indies, and took 26 days in total to reach Sydney. For the passenger flight leaving London on 1 October 1932, the Eastern route was switched from the Persian to the Arabian side of the Persian Gulf, and Handley

Page HP 42 airliners were introduced on the Cairo to Karachi sector.



In 1934 the British Government began negotiations with Imperial Airways to establish a service (Empire Air Mail Scheme) to carry mail by air on routes served by the airline.



The Empire Air Mail Programme started in July 1937, delivering anywhere for 1/2 d. per oz. By mid-1938 a hundred tons of mail had been delivered to India and a similar amount to Africa.



Note for thought, what a subject to research: In an article from "BNA Topics" Aug. 1946 publication by F. W. Campbell titled "Post Office Perplexities" it is mentioned about "..the problem of Post Office Names and Listings. English language listings at times used the French name (in Quebec)-but placed it alphabetically in the list according to the English translation...This changing and translating names certainly creates and could create much confusion. The office of Isle Verte in Quebec with manuscript markings by the Postmaster on free mail where he was supposed to sign his name had the English translation of it "Green Island" as his post office, with the postmark spelling in French..."

C. P. DeVolpi writes a very informative article about "Canada's Third Circular Type Handstamp Markings" in the May 1960 BNA Topics Vol.17, No.5 issue. **Isle-Verte** is listed under "**L'Islet, L.C.**" not as "**Isle-Verte**" shown in the postmark on this cover.



Kathy Hartley

1959-2021

We have some sad news to share about Kathy Hartley who was known to so many friends of the Greene Foundation and who made such a wonderful contribution to our hobby through her work in the Library from 2013 through to the end of 2019.

Recently we learned that our enthusiastic member of the Library Team had passed away peacefully in her home last September at age 62. We had lost contact with Kathy over the past year and finally by meeting her neighbors we learned the sad news.



She will be remembered forever by all of us for her enthusiasm in reaching out to such a wide array of collectors and encouraging their use of the Harry Sutherland Philatelic Library. Before Kathy none of us on the management team at the Foundation ever had the ability or the inclination to reach out in the manner personified by Kathy. She opened up the Greene Foundation to the hobby. This was done completely on her own initiative. She became the key marketing representative of the Library to the philatelic community.

Her successes were exemplified by offering open Saturdays at the Foundation, the creation of the Friends of the HSPL Newsletter, which has continued monthly to this day, and by her attendance at many shows

and conventions in and outside Toronto. Kathy arranged visits to places of philatelic interest and made trips across Canada and notably New York 2016 on her own to visit clubs and shows. All of this then received coverage in her newsletters, which attracted several hundred regular recipients.

She became interested in postal history and simply the history of interesting companies which had generated collectable mail. She created an exhibit about Toronto's philatelic heart at Adelaide and Victoria streets where so many dealers were located. This was shown at the 2018 Postal History Society symposium. As a result of her outreach the Library received a considerable amount of donated material. When it became a little overwhelming Kathy generously arranged for us to temporarily store it at a family residence.

Today we are all benefiting from the wonderful contributions made by Kathy. Our Library is extremely well used, and we are able to provide good research capabilities. Kathy was so much more than simply the Research Librarian and will be remembered for how she embraced the collector community

We will all forever remember Kathy in our own personal way for the encouragement she gave us to enjoy our philatelic interests.
