

Presidents Comments

With the passing of Queen Elizabeth II, the Elizabethan era of stamp collecting has come to an end although undoubtedly, we will continue to see stamps and souvenir sheets issued commemorating various highlights of her long reign of over 70 years.

Now that Charles III has become king, we are in the "Carolean era." Philatelic items with Charles's image on them have started to be issued by various postal entities including Canada. It will take some time though before enough material is available to form collections of Charles III stamps and even longer to produce displays or exhibits. Since people use electronic media more and more for communicating with others and there is a huge decline in the use of mail services it probably makes sense for us philatelists to hang on to any items of mail that we receive that has Charles III stamps on them, especially ones used early in his reign.

Many local clubs often get enquiries from the public as to what to do with inherited or no longer wanted stamp collections from a person's youth. Most clubs have someone designated to handle such requests. The advice given varies from asking if there is a family member such as a grandchild or niece or nephew who might be interested in stamp collecting, to referring the person to a local dealer or an auction house if it is believed that there is a reasonable commercial value to the collection or accumulation.

Another option given is to ask if the person is willing to donate the material to the stamp club where it can be used for a youth program if the club has one or put the items into club auctions with the proceeds used to offset the club's operating expenses. If donating to the club is used, it would be appropriate to not only give a verbal thank you but also send a note from the club executive.

Since I am aware of an incident at a GTAPA member club where a donation was made and later the donor asked for it back (in the meantime part of it had been auctioned off) it makes sense to do what that club now does with donated lots. They have a form that states, "Stamp collection donated to the (name of club) as a generous unrestricted gift." The form is then signed by the person donating and is kept in the club's records. I suggest your club have a similar form available.

The NYPS Stamp Show on April 29th, 2023

The Society held its first show since the reopening of the Club on April 29th



Considering that the Club had reopened its doors only in December 2022 and that unfortunately only 14 of the old members had been retained and that the show was going to take place in a new location, all of us felt very nervous about how many people we could attract to this event. In addition to that at the last minute, 2 dealers had to cancel their participation due to health issues. However, the members of the Club did a very good job in promoting this first stamp show at the other club meetings and at the major stamp shows in Ontario, in addition to the promotion made by the Club in the press and on their Facebook page.

As a result, about 60 people showed up at the Edithvale Community Center during the day and the dealers were kept busy for all the 6 hours of the show.



The comments received by visitors and dealers at the end of the day were very encouraging. Most visitors and all the dealers plan to come back to our next show, which will take place towards the end of 2023.

At the end of the day, we also managed to enroll 3 new members, which brings the total of new members enrolled from the day of our reopening in December 2022 to 25. [Ed.: It is 50 at the time of publishing] This is on average 5 new members per month in the last 5 months. Probably this is a new record because none of us has ever heard of a Club capable of enrolling an average of 5 new members per month. This is definitely a confirmation that the Club is now alive and well and is here to stay.

There is still a lot to do to bring this Club to the level of standards that the best Stamp Clubs have in Ontario but on this special day, April 29th has given us a strong sign that we are on the right track and has given us a big boost in terms of confidence and self-esteem.

We would like to thank all those who have supported us and believed in us when we started the project of relaunching a "dormant" club. Without their help, we would not be where we are today.

Ratty, Tatty Covers Featuring: Good Cursive Handwriting Styles

These letters from the past would appeal to only a few collectors as they have been torn or damaged with the passage of time. However, as the handwriting and postal inscriptions are still legible and postage stamps have withstood wear and tear, they convey a great deal of information about the town they were mailed from as seen in their named postmarks and make good space fillers. Many of the early letters expressed many emotions of family relationships when sent across or would have been business or government correspondence.




Figure 3: Ted Kupka (right), President of the Barrie Stamp Club, helped arrange all the Lots on our joint auction table.

1854 England to Bombay, India – My Favourite Cover



1854, March 26, family letter from England to Bombay (now Mumbai), India addressed to Theadore C Hope who was one of the architectural photographer and author who worked at the Civil Services Offices in Bombay alongside with Colonel Biggs of the Bombay Artillery, who also was an architectural photographer in Bombay. His photographs of Ahmedabad are early documents of the splendor of the architectural beauty of that city.

This is a letter sent to British colonies by packet mail after the colonies received responsibility for their own Post Offices (England to India). It had a Red 1/- applied in manuscript.



INTERESTING FACTS:

From the book by Jane and Michael Moubray, "British Letter Mail to Overseas Destinations 1840 to UPU" (2nd ed.). Section 1.2 page 2: Ship Letters.

By 1840, the term "Ship Letter" was used to denote any letter carried by a privately owned vessel as opposed to one sent by a regular contract or Admiralty packet. Since the first Post Office Act of 1657 the regulation and charges for Ship mail had been contentious. Under the law, ships' masters were required to carry any letters entrusted to their care and deliver them to the postmaster at their port of arrival. The act provided neither carrot nor whip as there was no payment for the service nor penalty for failure, consequently, evasions were widespread.


Under the section titled "1.8 Accountancy" in the 3rd paragraph:

Letters sent to British colonies by packet mail after they received responsibility for their own Post Offices were, for many years, either stamped with the well known red 1d, or had a red 1 applied in manuscript. This denoted the amount (for a single rate) which was due to them for internal postage. Ship letter charges and registration fees, when divided, were always shared in the ratio half to the colony and half to the mother country.

A line on page 261 states as follows "...Although the Indian Post Office had been established as a legal entity in 1837, it is not credited with the customary 1d per rate on letters from Britain until September 1856; but when Registration was introduced in July of the following year the fee was shared equally as were the fines imposed on underpaid mail from the date of their introduction, September 1858. During the same year experiments in sorting on board ships were conducted.



Bramalea Stamp Club School Programme

After a three-year gap due to the pandemic, the Bramalea Stamp Club was again able to engage with students at a local school by introducing them to stamps and stamp collecting. Whereas in previous years several classes combined to view each presentation this year the presentation involved just one Grade 5 class of 22 students. Teacher Andrew Kinal, who along with Eva Tsapas was instrumental in 2016 in getting the club to prepare the program, invited us to his present school Alloa Public School in Caledon. Ingo Nessel and Bob Thorne and I gladly accepted.

A few weeks prior to the actual presentation I had delivered a good quantity of worldwide stamps to the school and Andrew was able to show his class a YouTube video presentation by "StampCat."

Following the modified PowerPoint presentation by Ingo, along with interaction by the students, the class proceeded with an assignment. Each student had to pick out a stamp from three different countries, use a dab of glue stick to adhere them to a prepared worksheet and then provide the following information for each stamp. Country of origin, continent (Turkey incidentally is on two continents namely Europe and Asia), the currency used, the image on the stamp and population of the country. Of course, the students had access to Chrome Book computers so could determine that stamps with the wording Magyar were from Hungary and those with Suomi were from Finland. Meanwhile, Ingo, Bob and I circulated among the students and helped answer questions.




